Is It You or Is It Me?

Message from Rabbi Michael L. Feshbach



I know something of what it is like to hold an unpopular opinion, to rely on specialized news sources with their own agenda, to face the withering gaze and only sometimes unstated scorn of those with opposing views. After all, I am a Jew, and I am a Zionist.

These days, as a supporter of Israel, I find myself in arguments with people with whom I agree about pretty much all other issues. These are my friends, these are allies, these are folks with whom I thought I shared values and a world-view. Could it be that, when it comes to Israel, I am right, and all of them are wrong?

I have thought about this question for a long time. And the answer, basically, is, well, yes. But only because (ahem) my position is so nuanced, balanced, and reasonable!

This is not, actually, a column about Israel, but I will share for those who are interested that I am among what sometimes seems to be a shrinking cohort of pro-Israel, pro-peace, progressive and left-leaning Zionists. This is what used to be called Labor Zionism, I suppose, although that was always too narrow a term. And the nuances of what is going on in Israel is an appropriate topic, for another time.

For now, I raise this only to state that holding an unpopular opinion, based on your own silo or circle, your own bubble of sources, is not a crime. It is your right to do this.

Opinions about Israel may be heated and intense. Attitudes towards the pandemic, though, are an immediate threat. You are welcome to your own opinion -- up until the point when your attitude, and your actions, pose a danger to others.

We are at – no, we are far past that point now. We are all at real risk from the ignorance and defiance of some, based for too many on a warped view of an "American individualism" more committed to its fanatical view of freedom than to sanity, safety, responsibility or even morality.

I live in the United States Virgin Islands. As of late July we rank fifth from last in the nation in vaccination rates -- above only Mississippi, Alabama, the Marshall Islands and Micronesia, but worse than Wyoming, Louisiana and Arkansas.

As far as I can see, there are four different groups resistant or opposed to getting the vaccine. Not all of these are found in large numbers here, but the groups are 1) those who do not trust the government because of past lies and racist medical experimentation, 2) those who do not trust the government out of fear and political orientation, mostly on the right, 3) a certain strain of libertarians and 4) certain (left-leaning?) holistic health enthusiasts.

There is a great deal of baggage behind all these perspectives. But a healthy community can, somehow, sort out facts from fear, truth from fantasy, anger at the crimes of the past from the real needs of today.

Yes, racism is real, and colonialism is part of our history, and these islands have been treated with scorn. And yes, yes, experiments happened, and governments lied.

But in this case, the vaccinated are right, and the anti-vaxxers are wrong. And at this point, vaccine resistance is right up there with those who still believe that the earth is flat. It is demonstrably wrong, delusional, and dangerous.

We face a common foe. And this is not just a personal choice. In the end the unvaccinated put everyone else in harm's way again, incubators and breeding ground for a future variant, one less likely to be tamed by the shots in our arms we have now.

Do you want evidence of a miracle in our lives? These vaccines were... are... as close to a miracle as we can find right now.

You want to rely on prayer alone to keep you safe? Prayer can be powerful. But, come on. This is like the woman who prays to win the lottery. And God answers: "Lady, help me out here! Could you at least...you know... buy a ticket?"

From the time of the Talmud, comes the story of a man on a boat. In the middle of a voyage at sea, he takes out an ax, and begins hacking away at the wooden bottom of the boat directly under where he is sitting. Others rush up to him! They beg him to stop. "But why?" he asks. "After all, this is my seat. You can't tell me what to do! I can do anything I want."

To those of us who live here, we are on the same island. Metaphorically, wherever we live, we are in the same boat. To get where we want, we have to go together. We have to teach, to show, to convince those with axes that all of us are affected by what any of us do. Or those who will not take care of themselves that if they are hurt then, that, too, may have an impact on others.

I am not speaking, here, of the right to bear arms. I am saying, rather, that it is right to bare arms.

May we all come through this, on the side of science and sanity and responsibility and, simply, knowing the difference, here, between what is wrong, and what is right.
